Secretary's Report (George Kibe)

Minutes to the May 8, 2017 General Board meeting were compiled, posted on the website, and distributed to Board members.

Multiple Post Irma website and Shout-out were released to inform members of current news and information.

Reminder that the terms for President JP Fane, Secretary George Kibe, and Website Chair Rose Cookman, expire in January. The Board is looking for anyone interested in serving the community as a Board Director to fill these three slot. To serve as a Board member a candidate must be a member of the Association (fee simple owner of title to any Lot in Golf Hammock). Interested parties should contact George Kibe at gwkibe@gmail.com

Committee Updates:

Common grounds including roads, culverts, drainage ditches (Chair: J.P. Fane)

Excavation Point Was scheduled to perform repairs/replacement of the following culverts during the months of June and July:

- 1. Culvert Located at 1707 Divot Lane
- Culvert Located at 2906 Waterwood Dr.
- 3. Culvert Located at 3101 Divot Rd
- 4. Culvert Located at 4234 Duffer Loop
- 5. Culvert Located at 4515 Duffer Loop
- 6. Culvert Located at 4613 Duffer Loop
- 7. Culvert Located at Bunker Dr. and Tennis Courts
- 8. Culvert Located at 3302 Cormorant Point Drive
- 9. Culvert Located at 4812 Duffer Loop
- 10. Eagle Court Bio Swale repair
- 11. Regrading and clean out of Mills Pond drainage ditches located in the area 4225 Duffer Loop, 4403 Duffer Loop, 1811 Sand Trap Court, 1819 Sand Trap Court, and 4811 Duffer Loop.

These activities were impacted and delayed as a result workload scheduling with contractor EPI and heavy rains associated with Hurricane Irma. The committee is working with EPI to reschedule and re-prioritize work.

A member complained that the ditch, excavated to relieve flooding along Duffer Road after the Hurricane, is spreading diseased filled water along its's length. The resident complained that no notification was received when the HOA dug the trench along the right-a-way and that the mud from the ditch was impacting the ability to mow. Another resident responded that they had the ditch water tested and it reportedly contained fecal matter from backed-up septic system along Duffer Road. This resident also stated that

the ditch should remain as it does provide the impacted section of Duffer Road with needed relief.

Several other members expressed their thanks to the Board for taking actions during the aftermath of Hurricane Irma to accelerate normalcy to the community.

October 9, 2017, activities since the last report on May 8, 2017

Post-Irma, the Committee took steps to clear fallen trees from roadways both by contracting emergency tree removal and participating with fellow Members to clear roads and assist with fallen and broken trees. Lerma's Landscaping arrived to do their monthly service and were directed to clear the storm debris from the two community entrance ways and planting beds.

Secretary George compiled a list of missing, damaged, or bent road signs, and the Committee organized to address these informational and traffic signs. The Senior Sign Team, Curt Passafume, Hardric McMillon, Pete Broksch, and Don Brewer stepped back out of retirement to assist with this emergency, and as of this date most signs are back in service with only a few missing signs yet to be ordered. There were many signs that needed repairs and straightening; several sign poles were replaced as were three stop signs.

Monthly irrigation system inspections by the volunteer team of Cindy Bowser, Nancy Beatty, and Mark Walczak were completed during May, July, and August. DC Irrigation performed their quarterly maintenance services in June and September. These monthly inspections addressed malfunctions and kept the system operating reliably. Website and Newsletter requests for volunteers to continue these monthly inspections have not generated any responses from our Members.

Other activities,

- Cleaned and organized the inventory of signs, sign brackets, and hardware into storage crates at the maintenance barn.
- Several lamps and florescent tubes were replaced at the main entrance walls.
- Assisted several Members to work with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission to remove a nuisance alligator from Mills Pond.
- Reviewed and renewed the working agreement with Lerma's Landscaping.
 Several elements of their work were updated, but the monthly service fee remained the same at \$600.
- Had Lerma's clear the drainage ditch along Hammock Road of accumulated weeds and debris.
- Cleaned a half-dozen signs around the Community to remove stains and environmental build-up.
- Repaired one of our golf cart crossing signs near the 5th green, a victim of a hit and run accident.

At the May meeting, the Board directed the Committee to pursue a repair or renovation to our entrance walls at the Main Entrance. The wall caps are crumbling and the lighting fixtures are failing. Working with Nick McAngus of M&E Precision Construction, an RFP was developed and published. There were no responses to the published RFP. Several General Contractors were contacted directly and invited to submit bids. All declined to participate, including M&E Precision. Several concrete contractors were also invited to submit bids, but again all declined to participate in this custom masonry work. The Committee would appreciate input from the Board on the direction this activity should take.

At the May meeting, the Board directed the Committee to obtain and present pricing to repair the broken wire fencing behind Mills Pond. A preliminary review of the repair was conducted in early September, prior to the hurricane. Griffin Fence, the original installer of this fencing, participated in this review. The fencing was initially damaged by fallen

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trees, and has further deteriorated by vandalism. The land around the damaged fence section will require some clearing of weeds and fallen trees, and several other burnt tree trunks should be cut down to prevent future fence damage. The hurricane's effect on this section of fencing has not yet been determined, and the area is now flooded. So, Griffin will revisit and price this fence repair after the area becomes accessible.

Routine lawncare and landscape maintenance of Common areas continued without incident during this reporting period.

Violations/Complaints (Chair: Bob Schroeder)

In June wrote 4 violations about landscaping 2 remain open with 2nd letter.

July and August no letters but 8 visits all resolved.

In September issued 6 letters. All 6 are still open do to Irma.

New Business:

1. Golf Course access discussion (Jason Laman would like to discuss the HOA buying owner access to GC for recreation. e.g. access to Pool,

Tennis courts, cart trails etc.) This discussion was tabled to a future meeting at the request of Mr. Laman.

- 2. Treasurer Victor Divietro's resignation -- Victor stated his intent to resign from the Board of Directors effective December 31,2017. His resignation letter is attached.
- 3. 2018 Budget- Board member's and Committee chairs, were requested to prepare budgets for 2018 and be prepared to discuss them at the November 13, 2017 Board Meeting. For several years, the Board has been evaluating the drainage and road infrastructure serving the Community, and some repairs have been made and others have been scheduled to occur. The aftermath of Hurricane Irma has further illustrated the many shortcomings of this infrastructure. Early expenditures in 2017 were funded by drawing from savings accounts, however, future expenditures will require additional revenue from assessment fees. It is anticipated that during the budget discussions, the board will address increasing the yearly assessment to approximately \$500 per lot, to address current shortfalls and anticipated infrastructure project requirements. The Board will finalize budget plans for 2018 at the November 13 Board meeting and will vote for the 2018 assessment fee at the December 11 Board meeting.
- 4. Halloween- (The following minutes capture the discussion during the Board meeting. Afterwards storm debris was removed and the safety issue was mitigated. The board decided that cancellation of the event was not necessary and so no action was taken.) Several members requested the Board cancel the community involvement in Halloween this season because of safety related concerns with storm debris. There was discussion about closing the community and hiring police to turn away "Trick or Treaters". The audience was informed that while Golf Hammock Roads are "Private" they are "Public access " roads and the community can not bar access. The Board decided that safety is a concern with the number of visitors for this event and to take the following actions:
 - 1. A member Donna Ratterree would contact the local radio station to air a message that Golf Hammock is not participating this year.
 - 2. JP Fane will contact the local newspaper to get a notice published.
 - 3. JP Fane will get a banner created , to be placed at the main entrance, notifing entrants that the community is not participating this year.
 - 4. Members are requested to turn off yard and porch lights to discourage

"Trick or Treaters".

Note:Members that have already prepared for this year's event are being welcomed by our neighbor, Sebring Christian Church, to participate at their "Trunk or Treat" event at 4514 Hammock Road. This event runs from 6pm to 8 pm, Tuesday October 31. Participants are asked to arrive at 5:30 pm and remain until 9 pm to avoid the arrival and departure of children. Golf Hammock members wishing to park a car at the church should contact Tod Schwingel, 863.382.6676, for more information.

Member Comments:

A member reiterated her thanks to the Board for actions in an attempt to speed the recovery efforts.

A member stated that the board should address with County Management why "Progressive" is not fulfilling their contract with respect to yard debris removal and particularly the large amount of bagged debris.

The next General Board Meeting will be held on Monday, November 13, 2017 starting at 7:00 pm. A workshop will precede the meeting at 6:30 pm.
